Dear Members and friends of the Eastern Regional Association of Advent Christian Churches,

It is a humbling thought to consider Peter's words to those present when the Holy Spirit came upon the believers at Pentecost, as recorded in the book of Acts. We are confident in the hope that belongs to us and to their families, won by our Savior Jesus. Please join us in praying for the church families in Pittsfield and Farmington, as they continue to trust the Lord's leading in finding a pastor.

For the Maranatha Conference Board, I express my gratitude for the efforts by many of you who have sought to continue to be unified as we work together in serving the Lord. Efforts toward solidifying our statement of faith, evaluating our means of reporting, and revitalizing our collective education efforts through works like the Ministry Training Institute are laying an important groundwork for the generations of folks who will follow after us.
